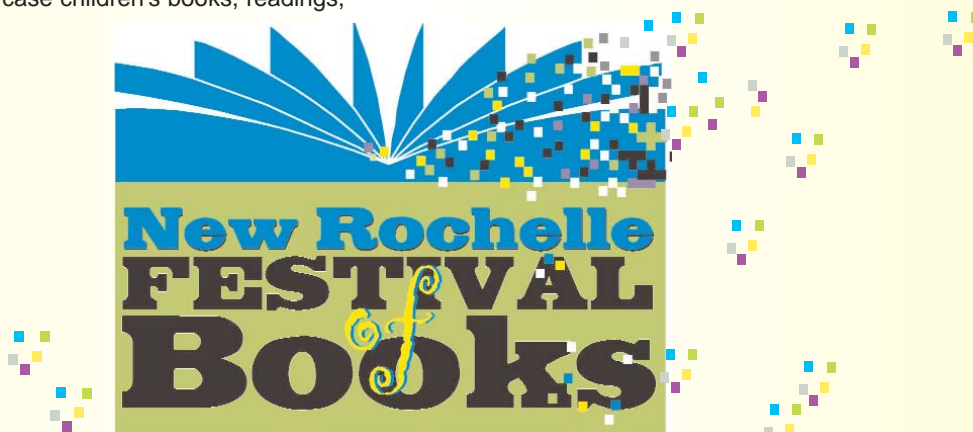

## The New Rochelle Festival of Books

A Partnership of the New Rochelle Public Library and the Harlem Book Fair  
in conjunction with the City of New Rochelle

On **Saturday and Sunday, June 20 & 21, 2009**, the New Rochelle Public Library and Library Green will be transformed into an exciting marketplace of books, food, and cultural concessions for the first annual **New Rochelle Festival of Books**. Throughout the library and the two-day event, dozens of local and internationally-known authors and local performers will offer insightful presentations and entertaining performances. Especially for kids and their parents, a Children's Space in the library's Alphabet Garden will showcase children's books, readings, storytelling and crafts.

The Harlem Book Fair was founded in 1999 by QBR The Black Book Review as a community event and forum for African American readers to discover, experience and celebrate African American history and culture through books. From the success of that first book fair, the event has grown to become the country's largest community gathering of readers and book lovers. It has evolved into a national brand, and expanded into new markets - including New Rochelle on this June weekend!

## Message from the Director

Dear Patrons,

On May 19th, residents will be given an opportunity to vote on the 2009/10 Library budget. Our proposed budget will see an increase of 2.49% in the tax levy for New Rochelle residents (an average of about \$8.00 per year). This growth is specifically tied to fixed increases (contractual obligations and utilities) and the need to maintain the infrastructure of our facilities

The May 19th vote will also allow for the election of 2 vacant Board of Library Trustee positions. The Library Board plays a pivotal role in the setting of policy as well as oversight of operational management for the organization. Since our Board consists of 7 officeholders, our newest members will be very influential in the future direction of the Library.

The following statistics illustrates the extraordinary activity of your library:

- Circulation loans are 4th highest in Westchester County
- Reference questions answered are 2nd highest in Westchester County
- Patron visits are 4th highest in Westchester County

Despite our success, our tax support is modest:

- Local public support per capita is 6th lowest in Westchester County
- Local public library materials support per capita is 8th lowest in Westchester County

I urge you to participate in the Library Election/ Budget Vote on Tuesday, May 19th between the hours of 7 am and 9 pm at Board of Education polling sites scattered throughout New Rochelle.

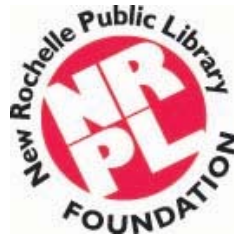

**Adult Fiction:** *Sophia's Choice* and other novels by Susanna Kearsley  
Susanna Kearsley presents two beautifully dovetailed stories in *Sophia's Choice* (alternate title: *The Winter Sea*); her main character Carrie McClelland is an historical novelist writing about her ancestress Sophia and the Jacobite uprising of 1708. Following Carrie's research and her growing relationships with the quirky residents of a small Scottish town is as interesting as following the intrigue and romance that surrounds Sophia. Canadian Kearsley isn't as widely known as she deserves to be; if you like this one also try her earlier titles *Season of Storms* and *The Shadowy Horses*. *Beth Mills*

**Adult DVD: TELL NO ONE (2008)**

Pediatrician Alexandre Beck, still recovering from the murder of his wife Margot eight years earlier, opens an e-mail message one day and finds a real-time video of Margot, who is seemingly still alive. Her message to him: "tell no one". Based on the bestselling novel by Harlan Coben, this critically acclaimed French thriller was a big hit with American audiences last year and will have you on the edge of your seat. *Chris Poggiali*
