## Message from the Director

Dear Patrons,

The months of September and October will see the beginning of many exciting new Main Library projects designed to enhance your library experience.

These projects include:

**Enhancement of Teen Area:** Thanks to a New York State Library Construction Grant and matching financial support from the New Rochelle Public Library Foundation, our Teen space will see the construction of a separate and enclosed space within our library. This upgraded Teen space will feature an open, comfortable and movable interior allowing for appropriate furniture placement and the highlighting of teen book collections, up-to-date technology as well as standards and rules for behavior necessary in maintaining order.

**Digital Signage:** Financed solely by the New Rochelle Public Library Foundation, this electronic sign will be located in the area adjacent to the circulation desks and will provide wonderful assistance to patrons seeking directory and wayfinding information as well as library programming opportunities.

**Enclosure of Children's Study/Tutoring Area:** Again sponsored solely through the financial support of the New Rochelle Public Library Foundation, this recently created tutoring/study area will be enclosed in glass thus allowing for a quiet space in our extraordinarily active Children's Room.

While these efforts will allow for long term substantial improvements in library service, some short-lived inconveniences to you (as well as staff) in relation to the construction surrounding these projects will occur. Our goal is to complete these tasks on time and under budget with the safety of you as our most important consideration.

So please be understanding in the next few months if you discover the library landscape to be somewhat disorganized and noisy. Be assured that "this too shall pass..."
